

# What if you could learn if your dog's sight is at risk *with a simple screening?*

**One in 22 dogs suffers from Dry Eye, a painful condition that could lead to permanent blindness if untreated.<sup>1</sup> Often, by the time a pet owner sees the signs, it might be too late to reverse damage caused to the dog's eye.**

All dogs can develop Dry Eye, but it is especially common in middle aged to older dogs, dogs with diabetes, Cushing's syndrome or hypothyroidism, dogs with a history of treatment with certain antibiotics, eye infections or canine distemper and certain popular breeds such as Cavalier King Charles Spaniel, West Highland White Terrier, Shih Tzu, Cocker Spaniel, Pekingese, Yorkshire Terrier, Lhasa Apso, Pug and Bulldogs.

A quick, 60-second Schirmer tear test can diagnose Dry Eye, which is manageable when caught early. I can help you with a management plan that can save your dog from going blind.
